Heritage Day Report

What a beautiful day, and what a successful event! Over 1,000 kids came to HPSA to enjoy a day in the outdoors. They caught 400 trout, crested 400 arrows, painted 400 bird houses, tied flies, made fishing lures, painted their own t-shirts, shot hundreds of arrows, 14,000 paint balls at ducks, 2,000 22 rounds, hundreds of black powder, and 2500 shotgun rounds. They watched people dressed as cowboys & cowgirls do shooting exhibitions. People dressed as Indians made their own tee-pees, bow and arrows, and demonstrated native dancing!

The kids watched retriever and pointer dogs actually "point", learned how to trap and saw furs of many different animals. They were petting the farm animals from Wolcott Mill Farm, checking out the Macomb Co. Sheriff's Dept. equipment, sitting in an Army humvee (thanks to the National Guard) and also got an education on how to escape a burning house thanks to the Lenox Twp. Fire Dept. Everyone ate great food, won raffle prizes, and loved riding down the big slide. The new laser shoot was a big hit this year!

It takes 150 people to run this event, and the members came through BIG TIME! The "Champs" this year had to be the ground's crew... what a beautiful job they did on making this club look like a park! Also impressive was the clean-up crew at the end of the day - in less than two hours they had everything down and put away, including the parking lot stakes and string. It is hard to believe what takes almost two weeks to set-up can come down that quickly! THANK YOU!
